<u>Middle School ELA Literacy/Novel Study</u>: Both rooms will actively engage the students to read and study a new novel based on the main theme that is connected to the basal. *The Little Prince* (306) and *Esperanza Rising* (310). Within the stories, students will learn about literary elements, comprehension skills, critical thinking skills, higher-order thinking questions, annotation, and write reflections.

306 -5th/6th We will focus on vocabulary development, comprehension skills and strategies, spelling patterns, and the 6 +1 writing traits using **The Little Prince**. We will incorporate school's social emotional learning theme with ELA and Social Studies each month. Students are encouraged read on a nightly basis to create a life-long reader!

310 - 7th/8th Literacy/Novel Study: Main Theme: Culture, Identity, *Esperanza Rising*Students will be reading about stories that matches the theme within the basal. Within the stories, students will learn about comprehension skills, annotation, and write reflections.

Students will read stories/informational texts that focus on identity and culture (diversity) in Unit 1. The skills we are focusing on include: learning how to annotate with texts; identifying theme/central idea, analyzing the elements of a short story; analyzing the story's plot development; applying vocabulary in a specific domain; using context clues to figure out the meanings of the unfamiliar words from affixes with Greek and Latin roots.

ELA Literacy/Writing Across the Content:

306 - **5th/6th** - Students with practice narrative writing and write reflections from passages using the 6 writing traits.

310 - 7th/8th - Students are learning how to critique one's another writing with both positive and negative feedbacks. They also are learning how to practice their questioning and answering techniques with given stems. Writing Across the Content Areas: Narratives and Comparative Writing; Article Reflections; writing **CER** (claim, evidence, reasoning) with

explanations.

306 - 5th - Understand Place Value 理解数位值

Middle School Science:

306 - **5th/6th**- Students will learn about the process of conducting scientific experiments. The main focus for this month is Properties of Matter. Topics we will explore include what makes up matter? How can matter be described? What are solids, liquids, and gases? What are mixtures and solutions?

310 - 7th/8th - Students will learn about *Matter and It's Structure, Function and Interactions* with the new implementation of Next Generation Science Standard 8 practices: Developing and Using Models; Analyzing and Interpreting Data; Planning and conducting investigations; Using mathematical and computational thinking; Constructing Explanations; Designing and evaluating solutions; Obtaining, Evaluating, and Communicating Information

Middle School Social Science:

306 -- **Life in the Western Hemisphere** The essential question is - Is a civilization based on what it controls or what controls it? Students will explain how early people reached the Americas, and describe their ways of life. They will identify the cultures that developed in different parts of North America. They will describe the powerful civilizations that arose in the Americas

310 -- Incorporating Character Education as Part of the Social Studies curriculum:

310 - 7th/8th - Students will focus on character traits, communication skills and ways to show acts of kindness to others as becoming good citizens in order to promote positive learning environment with . Students will be recognized on the daily basis with this gold slip of to honor students who show acts of kindness to others with love and care, taking own responsibility to care for their own individual learning, show respect to everyone at school, being honest citizens, be brave or take courage to share their ideas/thoughts in class, and be more self-discipline in paying attention in class and taking more ownership of her/his own learning.

310 - 7th/8th - Students will learn about geography of North America matching to the school theme and integrating the setting of the novel, Mexico to study how to draw out a

map and label the places by applying different map skills.
