### c. PPLC - Professional Personnel Leadership Committee

PPLC surveyed Primary teachers about the new Wit and Wisdom curriculum. Teachers shared -

#### **Pros:**

- There are many hands-on activities for students to build their comprehension skills. The curriculum also has good book selections!
- It is rigorous and goes along with foundations. It encourages discussion and has a writing component. Supposedly, the topics build from one year to the next. There is a workbook and small group materials.

#### Cons:

- The layout of the teacher manual is hard to read.
- It does tend to stay in the same book for several lessons, so students (and teachers) get tired/bored.
- For bilingual students, many skills and concepts are covered in one lesson. Vocabulary, assessments, and other materials are too tricky for first-grade ELLs. And there is limited visual support.

- -Ms. Cheung, ELPT, attended the Network (6) ELPT In-Person Training Session #3 on February 27.
- -Our network 6 EL Specialist, Grace Oh, conducted the "school visit" with Ms. Cheung and bilingual teachers on March 1 at 9:00 to 11:00 am. She visited all the bilingual classrooms and was impressed by all the instructional planning and visual support that the teachers are using for the multilingual students.
