

• Room 315/ Science- Students will continue to be food scientists working for Good Food Production, Inc. Students are introduced to a new problem - create a new salad dressing with a flavor, texture, and appearance that appeals to consumers. They begin by figuring out how to make a salad dressing without sediments. As they do, they are challenged to use their understanding of the particulate nature of matter and of the properties of molecules to explain why some solids dissolve, and others do not.
